GJS is one of the leading pioneer non-government, non-profit making, non-political and social service oriented organization in district of Khurda, Odisha. Its aim for the welfare of the poor and needy people and adopting its program to redress the problem of the people, it identifies various problems facing by the youths, women, children & elder persons in the district of Khurda, Puri, Ganjam, Koraput, Jharsuguda and Sundargarh. It is creating awareness among the people & the local inhabitants in the best possible ways through its dedicated personnel. Its main trust is to bring the under privileged sections of the society into the national mainstream and to provide a better standard of living with growth & development.

From its inception GJS has been engaged in the livelihood security of the tribal and economically section. GJS believes that development can only be initiated by people, can be achieved by people's initiative and sustained through their collective action.

# Activities on HEALTH

### **Community Process**

During this year we have got opportunities to conduct varies activities for the urban population of Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation areas. As a part we have formed 76 no of Mahila Arogya Samiti (MAS) in different slums. Special campaign regarding Dengu, Malaria, Diarrhea has been conducted in those slums. MAS members have been trained who to keep their accounts, training for utilization of united fund has been given to the MAS. Following programs have been taken over throughout the year.

**Management of UPHC in KFA** 

NUHM framework mandate for Urban Primary Health Centre (UPHC) in every 50,000 urban population. This will be achieved by both adapting/upgrading the existing facilities and adding new ones. The geographical and social distribution of UPHCs within the city will maximize access for the urban poor. The UPHC should address the health needs of the urban poor, unorganized workers, including both in notified and non-notified slums and people living in the urban areas also.

It will be the explicit mandate of the UPHC to provide priority services to urban poor people, especially those in most difficult circumstances such as street and slum children, the aged, disabled, single women, unorganized workers in unsafe occupations, and survivors of violence. The UPHC will not only integrate RMNCH+A services but also integrate all vertical disease control programs and non-communicable diseases program. It must also cover the preventive, promotive and curative services.

In 2019-20 we have got 2 no of new sanctions for management of UPHC in KFA. 1<sup>st</sup> one is on Gandhinagar, Koraput and 2<sup>nd</sup> one is on Jharsuguda town. About 11 lakh urban people have got health care facilities by our 5 no of UPHCs of different district and town. It provides comprehensive primary health care and acceptable standard of quality care to the urban population in general and particularly the urban poor. As per the Govt. notification no. 5993 dated March 2014, the OPD services has been provided twice in day i.e. (8.00 am to 11.00 am) morning and (5.00 pm to 8.00 pm) in the evening. The notified timings will be strictly followed by our organization. Specialist OPD services has been provided free consultation on specialist services as per the need. We have engaged manpower by follow the guidelines of NHM. O & G, Paediatric, Dental, Medicin, Skin, eye specialist has been engaged in every UPHC. We have achieved around 45,000 OPD attendances & 9300 laboratory test per each UPHCs during the year.



### Urban Mobile Health Unit (UMHU)

To provide better health care services according to their vulnerability (most vulnerable groups, mild vulnerable groups and least vulnerable groups)as per NHM GIS mapping system. To address the health issues of the vulnerable groups, especially the poor urban slum dwellers by providing preventive, primitives and curative health care services at their doorsteps on routine manner .To create an enabling environment through awareness generation for improved health seeking behavior towards public health; Mobile Health Unit has been deployed by NHM. Our organization has got permission to running 3 no of UMHUs in Bhubaneswar & Rourkela. 2 no of UMHU have been giving services in 102 no of slums of Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation and 44 no of slums of Rourkela Municipality. Around 82,000 slum populations have got benefit by UMHU in this year.

The Mobile Health Unit has been providing services for floating population in bricks kilns construction sites & other locations, Night shelters, Railway station, Habitation & work places of temporary migrants Street children, rag pickers, rickshaw pullers as well as Vulnerable slum population residing more than two kilometers distance from the UPHC/UCHC. It basically provides

- 82,000 Consultation and treatment of common ailments.
- 15,000 referral of complicated cases wherever required.
- 2,000 early detection of suspected TB, Malaria, Leprosy, along with referral for confirm sick and other locally endemic communicable diseases and non-communicable diseases such as hypertension, diabetes and cataract cases etc.
- 5,000 and above Ante-Natal checkup and related services e.g. injection tetanus toxoid, iron and folic acid tablets, basic laboratory tests such as hemoglobin, urine for sugar and albumin and referral for other tests as required
- 302 no of institutional delivery cases
- 285 no of Post-natal checkup
- Coordinate with 216 no of Routine Immunization
- 2500 persons has been counseling for spacing and permanent method
- About 10,500 no of Nirodh, oral contraceptives, emergency contraceptives has been distributed

### **Special Program**

Some special program related to health need of the urban poor have been taken by our organization in the year 2019-20. Collection of blood samples for Thalasemia & sickle cell in remote villages of Rourkela have been conducted with active support of SANKALP NGO. We have collected 10,000 blood sample in 10 no of camps and among which 700 patients were detected Thalasemia.

A special health check up camp has been conducted in Govt. ITI College of Bhubaneswar. Above 200 students and lecturers have treated in that camp.

### Adolescent Health Program (Project WAJOOD YUVA)

The project "Wajood Yuva" particularly in Bhubaneswar City Slum area, supported by population services international and implemented by Gopinath Juba Sangha (GJS), is in operation since last nine and half month in 35 wards of 233 slums in Bhubaneswar City Khurda District, Odisha. Wajood Yuva program focuses on adolescent girls and boys in the age group of 15 – 19 years and young men aged 20 – 24 years in the urban slums of Bhubaneswar, Odisha for demonstrating innovative models in engaging adolescent and communities. The project will also advocate and explore opportunities of replicating the learning across other project areas and Rashthriya Kishor Swasthya Karyakram (RKSK). By involving them directly into the process of Sensitization, identification, realizing and practicing knowledge gained related to innovating measures. Main objectives of the program as follow....

- Issues related to ASRH.
- > Teen age pregnancy /child marriage within the age of 14 to 19 years
- > Lack of knowledge, attitudes and behavior in relation to SRH.
- > Married adolescence girls subjected to emotional or sexual violence.
- Unintended and unwanted pregnancy.
- Poor health and hygiene in the slums.
- Lack of access to sanitary pad/sanitary napkin.
- > Risk sexual relationship: Adolescents keeping sexual relation without using condom.
- Unaware of HIV AIDS.
- Role of parents and community to empower Adolescent boys and girls.
- > Create enabling environment for Adolescent boys and girls to express their issues and problems.
- Support peer education processes.
- > Encourage adolescents to avail free treatment and counseling in the SRADA clinic.
- Adolescent boys and girls should be encouraged to attend the UHND meeting to receive iron tablets and counseling on privacy of sexual diseases.

We have mapped 13875 adolescents from 14044 house hold. 147 no of parents meeting have organized and 4802 no of parents have got training. 273 no of Adolescent Health Day have conducted and 8667 no of adolescent boys and girls have trained on those events.

To create awareness regarding TB dieses we have organized 2 no of TB Awareness programs in Rajas & Alisisasan Gram Panchayat of Balipatna Block. About 600 local people, 8 voluntary organizations, so many frontline workers have got some knowledge about TB dieses. Dr. P C Rath & Dr. Lili Das have briefly discussed the danger sign of TB and how to fight against the disease.



### Old age day care

Old age day care centers primarily focus on providing care for people with a specific chronic condition, including: Alzheimer's disease and related forms of dementia; additionally, these services may be available for any adult with disabilities and also the elderly population. In the year 2019-20 our organization has organised 2 no of day care camps on our premises to provide health care services to the old age people who are suffering from various dieses and living in the society with mentally torture by their sons and house members. This program aims to build up confidence and ability to maintain an independent lifestyle along with improving physical and mental health. We have organised 5 no of day care programs in this year and we also involved the school and college students to aware them how to care their parents on old age.



### **Education Program**

#### **Yoga Education**

During this year 5 no Yoga Education programs organized in secondary and upper primary school of Balipatana block under Khordha District. In this program was appreciated by the teachers and also students because the student and teacher were keep consternation on education. This year GJS also successfully organized mega Yoga camp at Alisisasan with the help of Artatrana bidya Niketan. In this camp more than 200 peoples were participated and learnt on utility of meditation.



#### **Cultural Education Program**

Demand generation will cover mass media, mid media and IPC and other community based activities such as BCC, as per the need of the project area. Mass media and mid media would be used depending on the availability of material from the public sector. However interpersonal communication towards BCC would form the basis of the program. In addition the GJS have organized 2 street plays, wall painting to communicate with the people and also conduct competitions and other activities to increase community participation and awareness. This program will also create demand for services related to health and its determinants through various groups.



# Water & Sanitation

#### **Cleanness & sanitation drive**

The Swatchha Bharat Mission is a comprehensive programme to ensure sanitation facilities in rural areas with broader goal to eradicate the practice of open defecation. The concept of sanitation was expanded to include personal hygiene, home sanitation, safe water, garbage disposal, excreta disposal and waste water disposal. In this year we have take part on Swatchha Abiyan in some Muslim Basti of Khordha district. All office bearer and staffs have been taken part on this Abhiyan and 5 no of campaigns have been conducted during 2019-20. We have also collected garbage from door to door on Rourkela City in collaboration with **SANKALP NGO**, Rourkela.

#### Awareness on open defection free

No country in the world has more open defecation than India, where one in two people defecate outside. Every year, 200,000 children in India die from diseases caused by fecal contamination. Although open defecation has been reduced by 31% since 1990, about 300 million women and girls in India still have no other choice.

To create awareness on open defection we have conducted 3 no of awareness meetings on Rajas, Sumana Gram Panchayat of Balipatna Block & Kargil Basti of Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation.



### **Women Empowerment**

During this year GJS provide small entrepreneurship training like Agarabati making, Spaices, Candel making, Badi & Papad making, Jam & Jelly and pickles to rural youth men and women by skilled person in regular basis. In this event GJS provide service like marketing linkages to rural women group those are involved in production work. 356 no of SHG members have been trained on 11 IGP training camps.



#### **Celebration of Important Days**

GJS has observed various national and International days in our operational areas like Republic day, Independence Day, World Population Fort Night, World Breast feeding week, children day, World water day, world AIDS Day etc. During this occasion mass rallies, padayatras, public meetings have been organized in slum areas. In this we have invited our Block chairman for flag hosting ceremony in the premises of our organization. He has distributed sweets and biscuits to the children and our organization gives awards to the best students of Artatrana Bidya Niketan who have secured 90% marks in 9<sup>th</sup> class Annual Examination.



#### **Programs for person with Disability**

People living with disabilities encounter many disadvantages in society and are often subject to stigma and discrimination. Marginalized and disproportionately poorer, people living with disabilities are particularly vulnerable to crisis. Further, they remain largely excluded from political and civil processes and voiceless on crucial issues that affect them and their society. The Government of India has envisaged an inclusive approach towards persons with disability and promised special attention to differently-abled people, among other vulnerable groups. Nevertheless, in India, skills and potential of

most people living with disability remain untapped, under-utilized or under developed. People living with disabilities are amongst the most impoverished communities in the country.

A training programme for Persons with Disabilities was organized simultaneously in training hall of Blind Association, Bhubaneswar. A total 110 participants in two batches were attended the training programme. This year we have conducted 4 no of disability programs in our block. The persons with disability were take part one exhibition. Our organization distributed three wheel bicycles, sticks for blind men, hearing instruments to disability.
